BEST TIME TO TRAVEL

APRIL, MAY, JUNE SEPTEMBER TO NOVEMBER

Although for the weather, the best time to visit Morocco is spring and autumn, when temperatures are nice and warm across the higher regions. There are many festivals held in the hotter month of June.

Average daily temperatures in June reach 35 degrees.
